

THE ALLIES RESPOND


### QUICK REVIEW

- ALLIES: GB, FR, US (1941),
  USSR (1941)
- □ AXIS: GER, JAP, IT
- □ 1939 1941: 1<sup>ST</sup> 2 Years
  - GER invades Poland,
    Denmark, Norway,
    Belgium, Netherlands,
    Luxembourg, France,
    Yugoslavia, Soviet Union
  - GER bombs GB
  - □ Japan attacks US → US now joins the war



#### ALLIES WAR PLANS

- GER defeat = top priority
- Stalin desperate for help
- "The Big Three" =
  Churchill (GB), Roosevelt
  (US), Stalin (USSR)
  - GB, USSR decide to focus on GER first
  - After GER defeated, USSR, GB can help U.S. against Japan



## BATTLE OF STALINGRAD

- Aug 1942: GER takes the Russian city of Stalingrad, then...winter comes
  - USSR uses "scorched earth" strategy (burning everything so GER army can't use it as they invade)
  - Severe urban warfare (house-tohouse fighting); not good for GER tanks
  - Cuts off GER supplies; GER soldiers freeze, starve
- Both sides order soldiers not to surrender
- Jan 1943: GER finally surrenders
  - GER = 300,000 lost
  - USSR = 1.1 million lost
- MAJOR turning point for Allies!





## NORTH AFRICA & ITALY

- GER & IT control North Africa
  - Under Dwight D. Eisenhower, Allies attack GER forces
  - May 1943: GER surrenders
- After Africa, Allies focus on Italy
  - Called "the soft, underbelly of the Axis"
- Summer 1943: Italy surrenders
  - Italy's king takes Mussolini out of power
  - Hitler takes over Italy and puts Mussolini back in charge
- "Bloody Anzio" = Invasion of Rome
  - Battle lasts 4 mo.
  - Allies: 25,000 dead
  - Axis: 30,000 dead



### D-DAY


US, GB plan invasion for 2 yrs

- Build up 3 million troops to attack GER-controlled FR
- June 6, 1944: paratroopers dropped behind enemy lines
  - GB, US, CAN forces attack France's beaches
- Largest land-sea-air operation in history
  - 156,000 troops
  - 600 warships
  - 11,000 planes
  - 4,000 landing craft

## D-DAY (CONT)

- □ US deaths: 2,500
- 95% of Allied casualties
  happened in first 5 min.
- Sept 1944: Allies free
  FR, Belgium,
  Luxembourg,
  Netherlands

# BATTLE OF THE BULGE

- Dec. 1944: GER breaks through Allies in Ardennes Forest (French border)
- □ At first, GER successful
- Jan 1945: Allies push GER back
  - Last major GER offensive

#### Deaths

- US = 19,000 (deadliest battle for US)
- $\Box$  GER = 15,600
