+ Western Front

■ Trench warfare

- Rat infested, no fresh food, impossible to sleep, diseases (trench foot)
- Soldiers charged across "No Man's Land" to enemy's trench
- Trench warfare → Stalemate
 - Neither side is winning...just losing soldiers
- Fighting → Shell shock
 - Reaction to intensity of bombings and fighting
 - Unable to sleep, walk, talk, control themselves
 - Seen as a form of weakness → many soldiers executed by their own governments

Eastern Front

- Long stretch of border b/w Rus., Ger., A.H.
- Stalemate, slaughter common
- Rus. had to fight Ger., A.H., and O.E. ALONE!
- Rus. vs. Ger.
 - Ger. crushed Rus.
 - Rus. in full retreat
- Rus. vs. A.H.
 - Rus. defeated A.H. army at first
 - A.H. had to split forces b/w Rus. and Serbia
 - A.H. eventually pushes Rus. back









+ Russia's Impact on WWI

- **■** Pros (+)
 - HUGE population
 - Forced Ger. to dedicate millions of troops to Eastern Front
- **■** Cons (-)
 - Not industrialized! Couldn't transport equipment to the front
 - Allied help was limited
 - Ger., O.E. controlled water access to Rus.

■ Result

- By 1916, Rus. gov. about to collapse
- 1917: Russia gets out of WWI (Russian Revolution)
- Signs Treaty of Brest-Litovsk → gives lots of land to Ger.

Ottoman Empire's Impact on WWI

- Joined Central Powers in 1914
- Seen as the "sick man of Europe"
- Won major victories against Allies at the beginning
 - Prevented Rus from getting help from Allies
 - Won Battle of Gallipoli against GB, FR
- Nationalist groups within OE rebelled
 - Armenians (Christians in OE) fought for Rus.
 - Arabs revolted, fought for independence
 - O.E. divided up at end of WWI
